- Humility is Christlike

“Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and **humble** in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light.”

THREE CHARACTERISTICS OF THE HUMBLE PERSON

1. They recognize and embrace their own worth and dignity.

2. They choose to act humbly.

3. They sacrificially serve others with the right heart motive.
... he took the humble position of a slave and was born as a human being. When he appeared in human form, he humbled himself in obedience to God and died a criminal's death on a cross.

Philippians 2:7-8 NLT

Humility is more about how I see and treat others
than it is about I think about myself.

Therefore, God elevated him to the place of highest honor and gave him the name above all other names, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue declare that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.
