WHAT IS A CREEKSIDE CHURCH MEMBER?

A Creekside Member is a follower of Jesus Christ who agrees with and is committed to Creekside Church. Members serve the church and desire the leaders of the church, along with other church members, to help them grow in their walk with Jesus and others.

Members. . .

- participate in communion as often and regularly as possible. Communion is open to all believers, whether or not a Member.
- participate in the programs and activities of the Church.
- serve in key leadership positions open only to Members as the opportunity arises and as appointed in accordance with the Church Constitution.
- use their spiritual gifts in the life of the body of the Church.
- financially support the ministries of the Church, according to ability and resources as God provides.
- protect the unity of the Church by honouring Church leadership and following a biblical model of conflict resolution as expressed in Matthew 18:15-17.
- attend and participate in Members Meetings.
- vote in person at all members meetings including Annual Meetings, Special Meetings and Information Meetings on but not limited to:
 - Strategic plans in summary form;
 - Church Budget in summary form;
 - Election of Elders of the Church;
 - Major initiatives of the Church, including but not limited to purchase, sale or lease of property, building programs, and the formation of a daughter church.

THE STEPS TO BECOMING A MEMBER

<u>Step One</u>: Participate in the Explore Creekside class. Explore Creekside is a prerequisite to membership. <u>Step Two</u>: Complete the Membership Application and Spiritual Story and return them to the church office

or email to membership@creeksidechurch.ca.

<u>Step Three</u>: Someone will contact you to interact with you about Creekside and membership and answer any questions you may have.

<u>Step Four</u>: The interviewer will submit your application, a digital photograph of you and their recommendation relative to membership to the Elders.

Step Five: The Elders will review your application and approve you for membership.

Step Six: You are a member! You will be welcomed officially at an official Church Business Meeting.

<u>Step Seven</u>: You are off on the great adventure of fulfilling your responsibilities as a member!

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MY SPIRITUAL STORY

Please write out the story of how you became a follower of Jesus.

WHY?

There are three reasons we ask for this.

- 1. It communicates that you know the essential elements of the gospel
- 2. It can help you personally affirm and celebrate who you are in Christ.
- 3. It provides you with a simple, personal tool for sharing the good news of Jesus with others.

HOW DO I WRITE IT?

<u>Length</u>: Your story should be no more than one typed page. If you would like assistance in putting it in written form, please contact the church. We would be happy to help in any way we can.

<u>Target Audience</u>: You are writing this to someone who is not a Christian and does not know how to become a Christian. You are writing this to share with them why and how to become a follower of Jesus.

Format: Your story should include three phases:

<u>Phase One – My Life Before I Became a Christian.</u>

Provide a brief description of your life before you became a Christian. If you became a Christian at an early age, briefly describe your home/church environment as a young child.

Example: I grew up going to church, but I didn't understand until my teen years what it meant to have a personal relationship with God. I pretty much did my own thing in high school. Sometimes I went to church, but only when my parents forced me. I struggled a lot with my sense of self-worth and purpose in life.

Phase Two – How I Became a Christian.

Describe specifically how you became a follower of Jesus. Describe how you received Jesus as your personal Saviour and God. Why did you decide to follow Jesus? What does it mean to commit to following Jesus? Include repentance and sin and faith. Include the story of your baptism here.

Example: When I was nineteen I had a friend, who told me about Jesus. He told me who he was and what he did for us. At first, I didn't know what to think. But as I wrestled with it, I realized that Jesus was God and he had come to deal with my sin which stood between me and God. Jesus took the consequences of my sin, death and died for me in my place on the cross. I turned in faith and reached out and trusted him as my sin forgiver and life leader. While I didn't completely understand it all I knew enough to know that this was what I needed to do.

Phase Three – My Life Since Becoming a Christian

Describe what God has been doing in your life since becoming a Christian. How has God helped you grow? Try to tie this in with any struggles you mentioned in Phase One of the testimony.

Example: Since becoming a Christian, God has really helped me out with my own sense of selfworth. I understand now that I am his child, that he loves me regardless of my imperfections, and that he gives me purpose in life. God has been teaching me what a blessing it is to love other people in practical ways. I thank God for continually teaching me and making me more like his Son, Jesus.

WHAT WE BELIEVE

THE BIBLE: We believe that the sixty-six books of the Bible are the unique and final authority for what one believes and how one lives. As originally written, the Scriptures were entirely free from error. Every word and all parts were inspired by God.

GOD: We believe in one God, Creator of all things, who is holy, sovereign and perfect in all He is and in all He does. He eternally exists in three equal persons, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.

- God the Father: We believe God the Father gives oversight to the ministries of the Lord Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit. He has laid down a plan for the ages and is working all things together to fulfill that plan.
- God the Son: We believe the Lord Jesus Christ is God the Son. We believe in His complete deity and humanity, His virgin conception, His sinless life, His death on the cross for the sins of the world and His bodily resurrection from the dead. He actively intercedes on behalf of the church and is preparing for His personal return to earth.
- God the Holy Spirit: We believe that God the Holy Spirit convicts people of sin. He gives spiritual life, baptizes, indwells, seals and sets apart for holy use everyone at the moment they become a child of God. He bestows spiritual gifts upon believers, and empowers them for daily living.

SATAN: We believe Satan is a created spirit being, the originator of sin, who revolted against God and now works in opposition to the people and purposes of God.

PEOPLE: We believe the first couple, Adam and Eve, were divinely created in the image of God.

Originally innocent, pure and in fellowship with God they fell from that position through the sin of disobedience. Their sin has left all people separated from God, condemned to physical and spiritual death and helpless to restore the original state.

SALVATION: We believe every person needs to be restored to life with God. Salvation is a gift from God graciously offered to humanity. It cannot be earned by any human effort. To receive this gift a person must repent, which involves turning from one's own way to God's way, and place their faith in the person and sacrifice of the Lord Jesus Christ. By placing one's faith in Jesus Christ a person becomes a child of God and begins a new, eternally secure relationship with God. Salvation will be evidenced by a changed life.

THE CHURCH: We believe that the church is composed of all who have become children of God. The local church is a gathering of believers, organized to do God's will through worship, teaching, fellowship, evangelism and ministries of compassion and conscience. The local church observes two ordinances: Baptism is the immersing of believers in water to signify their relationship with and commitment to Christ; Communion is the partaking of bread and wine by believers as a memorial of the sacrifice of Christ. The leaders of the church are Elders, who are responsible to give oversight to the church.

THE FUTURE: We believe in the visible and bodily return of the Lord Jesus Christ to earth. Those who are children of God will receive a resurrected body and live in the full enjoyment of God's presence forever. Those who are outside the family of God will be resurrected to spend eternity in everlasting punishment.

THE CONSTITUTION OF CREEKSIDE CHURCH

I. NAME

The name of this organization shall be Creekside Church. The effective date of this organization is August 1, 1989.

II. OBJECT

The object of this church is summarized in its Statement of Mission: Follow Jesus. Love God. Love People.

The beliefs of the church are set out in its WHAT WE BELIEVE statement. Activities of the church include worship, biblical instruction, the observance of the divinely instituted ordinances, the presentation of a corporate testimony to the power of the Gospel in its community, and the service which the Gospel requires both at home and abroad.

This organization shall be carried on without purpose of gain for its members, and any profits or gains to the organization shall be used on promoting its objectives.

III. MEMBERSHIP

- 1. Status: *Church Membership* is for Christians who are committed to the church.
- 2. Reception: Applicants may be accepted as Church Members after giving satisfactory evidence of personal faith in the Lord Jesus Christ, bearing testimony to their salvation through water baptism, completing the Explore Creekside Class, accepting the What We Believe Statement and Constitution of Creekside Church, and signing the Church Covenant.
- 3. Removal: Members are removed from membership on decease, or upon a recommendation by the elders. Should the elders desire it, or any member request it and the elders deem it necessary, a majority vote of church members will be required for removal of membership. Members will automatically be removed from church membership at the conclusion of a two-week waiting period which follows the announcement by the elders.
- 4. Discipline: Members failing to observe the basic principles of the Christian faith and conduct shall be approached for the purpose of restoration in accordance with the teachings of Matthew 18:15-20.
- 5. Voting Privileges: All members in good standing, eighteen years of age and older, may vote in any and all business matters of the church.

IV. OFFICERS

All officers shall be Church Members in good standing.

- Scriptural Officers
 - a. Elders (staff elders and volunteer elders)
 - The calling of an elder shall be made upon a 75% vote of the members present at a duly called business meeting.
 - ii) The dismissal of an elder shall be upon the majority vote of the members present at a duly called business meeting.
 - iii) The duties of an elder are primarily to teach and preach the Word, to give oversight to the church and to guard it from error.
 - iv) Staff Elders shall remain in office indefinitely, subject to review by the Board of Directors.
 - v) Volunteer Elders shall serve a term of three years. There is no restriction on the number of consecutive terms a Volunteer Elder can serve.

b. Ministry Pastors

- Ministry Pastors are hired by and accountable to the Staff Elders.
- ii) Ministry Pastors are to assist the elders in matters pertaining to the spiritual welfare of the church as well as carrying out business matters and administrative duties.

2. Legal Officers

- a. Board of Directors (volunteer elders)
 - The Board of Directors will consist of the Volunteer Elders as Directors, and the Staff Elders as ex-officio non-voting members.
 - ii) The duties of Board of Directors are primarily to have ultimate legal responsibility for the Church, including all strategic plans and financial affairs of the Church, including the preparation of annual budgets and financial statements, and maintaining the property and physical facilities of the Church.
 - iii) The Board of Directors shall at their first meeting each year, appoint such officers as they deem necessary (ex. Chair, Vice-Chair, Treasurer, Secretary).

V. GOVERNANCE

The government of this church and the administration of its affairs shall be by the church and such officers as it may direct. There shall be an annual business meeting of the church when full reports from all departments of the church shall be given and accepted by the church. Other meetings may be called from time to time by the elders of the church as necessary. Business meetings shall be announced three weeks in advance, including information as to the nature of the business to be dealt with in the meeting.

At any duly called meeting of the members those present shall constitute a quorum.

VI. AMENDMENTS

This constitution may be amended upon a 75% vote at any duly called business meeting.
